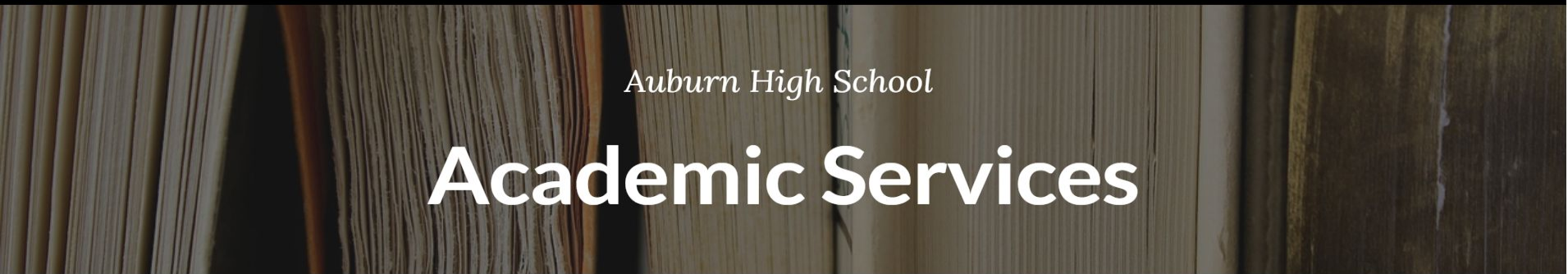

SUMMER CREDIT RECOVERY COURSES

Students who need to recover credit from failed courses can do so by enrolling in online summer school courses through IVSA (Illinois Virtual Schools & Academy). There will not be any in-person summer school classes at AHS, so this is the only chance for credit recovery this summer. If a student has failed a course they need for graduation and does not complete summer credit recovery, then they will be re-enrolled in that course next school year.

The registration fee for each credit recovery semester course is \$190. If a student needs both semesters of the same course, then the fee would be \$380. All payments are made directly to IVSA.

Summer school credit recovery courses begin on Tuesday, June 3rd and end on Friday, August 1st.

Registration for summer school credit recovery courses will take place on Monday, June 2nd from 8:00-11:00 am and Tuesday, June 3rd from 8:00-11:00 am. Chromebooks will be available to be checked out for the summer for students enrolled in credit recovery courses.

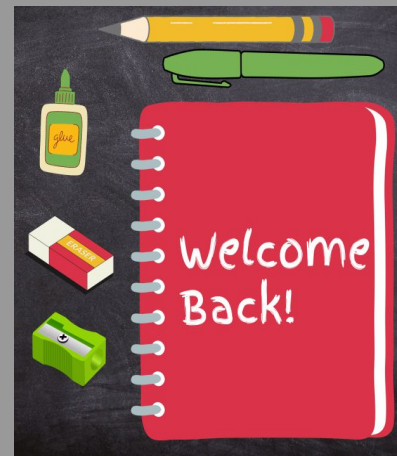

1st Day of School

- Doors open at 7:30 AM.

Typical Day at School at AHS

- preACT 9 Secure during your Freshman Year.
- preACT Secure during your Sophomore Year.
- ACT test your Junior Year.
- ACT and test scores can help tremendously with scholarships and entrance into college

Extracurricular Activities

- Extracurricular is an all-encompassing term. All activities outside of the typical classroom are considered extracurricular.

 - not passing 2 of their classes (per the normal weekly eligibility requirements). This is based on the semester grade, NOT quarter grade.

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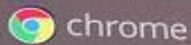

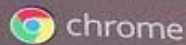
Student Handbook

- Student handbook is on our webpage & students will receive a planner (handbook included) the 1st day of school.
- No one is perfect – learn and grow as a person
- Be respectful to yourself and others
- Ask for help if you need it
- Our goal is to prepare students for their adult lives
- High School is a big step compared to being a student at the junior high. Increased expectations and increased maturity. The next step is our students being adults.





Chromebooks



-Students are issued these at the beginning of the year and are responsible for them all year long. (If damaged, students/families are responsible for paying repair costs.)

-Chromebooks are allowed to be taken home. They are solely for school use, not personal use. Internet is filtered, parents can regulate what students can access outside of school hours. (**Qustodio Parent App, this information is on the district website as well!**)

-Make sure it is charged and ready to go every day! Plug it in to charge when you charge your phone.



Cell Phones

- Cell phones should be kept in lockers and powered off during the instructional day.

- Students will be asked to give their phone up to staff if their cell phone is out:

- 1st offense: Phone will be turned into the office and student can pick it up at the end of the school day. Parent will be notified.

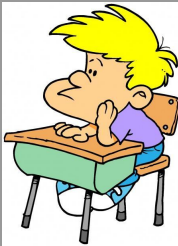
- 2nd offense: Phone will be turned into the office, a parent will be notified, and a parent must come retrieve the cell phone. It MUST be a parent, cannot be a relative/friend.

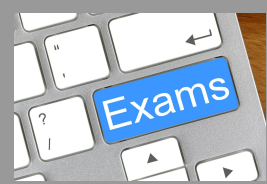
- 3rd offense: Phone will be turned into the office, a parent will be notified, a parent must retrieve the cell phone and a meeting with the principal must take place. Discipline may be issued, such as a detention.



Attendance Policy

- Attendance and academic performance are closely related.
- In order for a student's absence to be excused, the student's parent and/or legal guardian must call the school and inform the school of the absence.
- Please communicate with the office.
- After the 9th absent in a school year, the student will need a note from a professional for verification of an excused absence. A letter will be mailed home as a courtesy!
- Acceptable forms of verification will include a note from a doctor, psychiatrist, psychologist, dentist, clinic, hospital, or an official document for a court appearance.

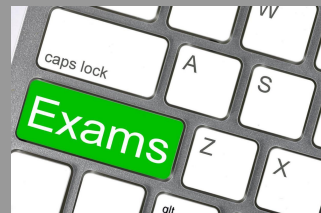
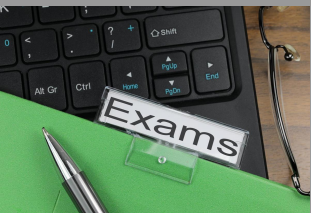




Semester Exams



- Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors are required to take ALL semester exams.
- Finals are taken the last two days of each semester: 1st-4th hour one day and 5th/6th-9th hours on the last day. Both days are 2:00 PM dismissals.
- As a senior, students can become eligible to be exempt from final exams IF they have met the minimum requirements set forth at the beginning of the school year.
Example: Grade must be an A or B, No more than 1 tardy/behavioral detention, etc.

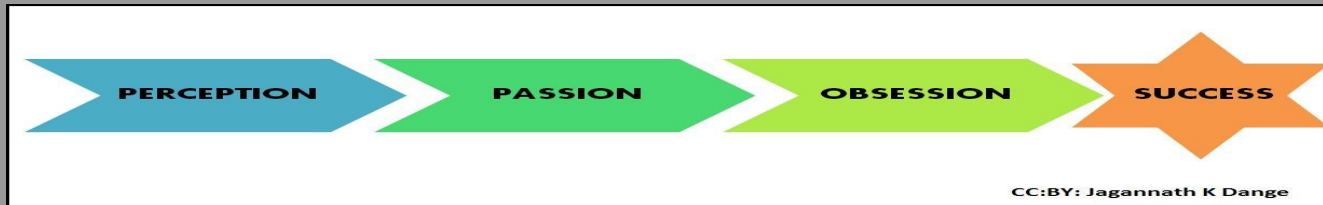




Enjoy the Experience at AHS!
